## *Description of Waynesville and Heighway Cabin*

We started early, baited at Martin Kever's, and then rode on to Waynesville. This little town is situated on the western bank of the Little Miami. The lots are sold to none but actual settlers, and though it was only settled last spring, about fourteen families are already here. They are also on an equality. Pride and slavery are equally strangers.

We lodged here with a Mr. Heighway, an emigrant from England, who with a number of his country people, suffered inconceivable hardships in getting to this country. It was curious to see their elegant furniture and silver plate glittering in a small, smoky cabin.

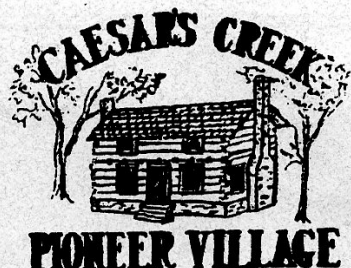

The mission and purpose of the Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village Association, a non-profit organization, are as follows:

1. To preserve, restore, and maintain the historic structures of Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village.  
(Preservation Function)
  2. ## The Right of Suffrage

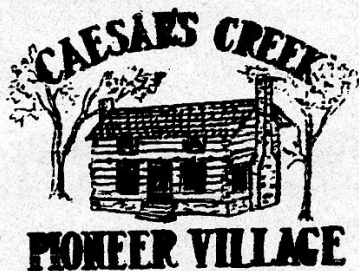

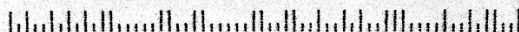
