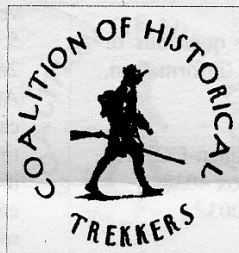
do or don't have.

can also swim and fish in the lake which has an arm close by the camp. Several traders have expressed an interest in attending and you are welcome to spread your trade blanket also. if you want to get away for a day or two, there are some interesting sites and attractions nearby including Fort Miegs. I think most anyone, and/or their family, will be able to come and have a good time.

Pioneer Village is open to the public and we may have some visitors during the week. Four of us went on a scouting trip in April and we were well received by the people we met in town and they expressed an interest in seeing what we are all about. One store owner is thinking about doing a talk on fabrics and bringing some samples. There is a \$10.00 fee per camp for the event which the COHT is donating to Caesar's Creek to help with the upkeep and further development of the site. There are no additional traders fees or other charges to attend. If you are trading your wares will be inspected for suitability to avoid the flea market atmosphere that has happened at other events. We are also asking for VOLUNTEER labor for about a half of one day to help with projects that are needed to maintain the buildings and facilities. Mostly what they need are people to help with chinking; the cabins but, if you are a skilled tradesman (plumber, electrician, carpenter) we hope you will bring some tools for basic work as they can really use some help in these areas. Everyone volunteering to help will be invited to a special dinner as our way of saying

thank you. Campsites will be designated for long-term and short-term attendees to keep the traffic in the camping area to a minimum and there is a separate parking area. Showers and toilets along with trash disposal are also available. Fishing requires a valid Ohio license which range in price from \$7 to \$24 and are available at a store within 1 1/2 miles of the camp where you can also purchase cold drinks, ice and other small items you may need. There is a Grocery store in Waynesville for more extensive stocking of your larder.

RULES GOVERNING THE

COHT 3RD ANNUAL GATHERING

1. We require that all participants be pre-1840 in every way. Remember that we are trying to portray a certain time period and clothing and near should be of the period of 1600 through 1840 for children as well as adults. This will be in effect from August 1st through August 9th. If you are not in compliance you will be asked to leave. There is a changing area close to the parking lot.

2. LONG TERM CAMP - No vehicles will be allowed from 5.00 p.m. Sunday, August 2nd until 8:00 a.m. Saturday, August 8th. Please have a camp official assist you in getting into and out of the camp. if you arrive late, or must leave early, we will assist you in moving your camp. SHORT TERM CAMP - If you are unable to stay for the whole week, please camp in this area as it will be closer to the parking lot and we will allow cars in with prior notice of a camp official. You must park in the designated parking area. We will also have a special parking area for any attendees who are disabled and need to get to their vehicle frequently.

3. Garbage disposal, showers and restrooms will be provided. Please use them. When carrying, trash or other non-period items into or out of your camp, please use a period appropriate cover such as a towsack or canvas bag to help preserve the atmosphere of the event for yourself and others. Brine your own toilet necessity.

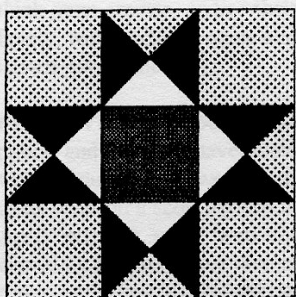

Meeting called to order at 7:15 p.m.

Minutes from meeting dated March 24, 1998 read and corrected. Don Dunkelberger moves to accept corrected minutes. Greg Knapik seconds. Motion carries. Kelly Maloney reads bills. Don Dunkelberger motions to pay bills. Linda Lee seconds. Motion carries. Larry Burns submits letter regarding insurance and liabilities. All trustees need to read before next meeting. Item tabled until next meeting.

Advertising Grant. We received \$5000.00 from County Commissioners. Shelley received copy of grant and what we're contracted to do. Need to provide updated information to Commissioners. Kevin will do this and make copy of grant to go with the minutes.

Kitchen. Need check for ladles. Greg Knapik thinks he got the plumbing fixed. Menu for School of the Soldier: They are doing a hog roast on Saturday night. Debbie is setting up standard price list for all events and will e-mail to trustees for their review. Kelly wants to know how much start up money is needed. Greg Knapik motions for \$200.00 for kitchen supplies. Linda Lee seconds. Motion carries. No opposes. Do we want to sell small trinkets left from General Store at the School of the Soldier? Kevin will check with contact to see if they have an objection.

Budget. Trustees had redone bud-

get on 3-30-98. Don Dunkelberger motions to approve revised budget. Linda Lee seconds. Motion carries. Ed Dorff opposes, he doesn't agree with it. He feels it's inflated.

Green Up Day. Don Dunkelberger presents his cost for mortar mix supplies. Ed Dorff asks Don to order 80 bags lime and 10-15 bags cement. Sand is coming by truck. Kevin asks for volunteers to be project leaders.

School of the Soldier. Many, many things planned. They want to use bake oven on Saturday, planned: sewing contest, cannon contest, edible plant contest, marching, chinking to name a few. Got State permission for cannon fire with 3 stipulations: 1. Let the Sheriff's office know what we are doing, 2. Let our neighbors know what we are doing, 3. Let fire department know what we are doing. Parking during event may be crowded. This will be addressed when people arrive. Factors in the decision, how much room do they need for drilling and how wet is the ground in the field. May expand the mowing in the field to create more room. A big concern: They do not carry their own insurance. Since they are asking to come to us, the liability falls back on them. Even so, we will have our lawyer draw up liability waivers for S of S participants. Need volunteers to be gatekeepers, wanderers, watch out, get waivers signed, kitchen, etc. Debbie will check on tee shirts for village members to wear at S. of S.

Water problems. Hole in water line in valve pit caused massive water leak (at the State's expense. We need to be really nice to them). Discussion follows on ways to fix the problem. Debbie Irons motions to do what's needed to get plumbing fixed before Green Up Day. Ed

Dorff seconds. Motion carries.

Don Dunkelberger abstains. Don Dunkelberger will get supplies to Kevin before Green Up Day.

Electrical Upgrades. Waiting for letter from State but could go ahead with doing pad outs. Ed Dorff motions to get such supplies. Greg Knapik seconds. Motion carries. No opposes. Ed and Kevin will work this out.

Communion at June Festival. Betty and Carl Ross want to have communion at Sunday Service in the Meeting House. Recommendation: 1.) They are valued members of CCPV. 2.) Morning worship program already decided on. 3.) CCPV cannot favor any one religion. 4.) They are welcome to have communion at their RV or at the lake. Shelley will E-mail these recommendations to Betty and Carl.

Advertising. We are going with 10 second spots exclusively. Kevin will make County Commissioners aware of these changes.

Gardens. FYI - using raised beds will eliminate problem with archeological survey.

Meeting House. Debbie Irons brought sample book to choose new wallpaper for Meeting House. Jerry has paint for Meeting House and some out building (like sassafras booth). Some paint was donated by Perry and Derrick.

Celtic Festival. A second Celtic Festival at Caesar's Creek State Park was in the works. Kevin spoke with Chuck Theiman at State Park. State thought we were not having our Celtic Festival. The organizers of the 2nd Celtic Festival thought we were not having our festival. When they found out we were, they said they would cancel their festival. Greg Knapik motions to adjourn. Ed Dorff seconds.

Minutes from Trustee Meeting dated April 14, 1998 read and corrected. Don Dunkelberger motions to approve corrected minutes. Ed Dorff seconds. Motion carries. Minutes from General Meeting dated April 14, 1998 are read and corrected. Larry Burns motions to approve corrected minutes. Linda Lee seconds. Motion carries.

Kelly Maloney reads treasurer report. Income from School of the Soldier, Kitchen & Gate:

\$1483.05. Kelly read bills. Greg Knapik motions to pay bills. Don Richards seconds. Motion carries. **Greenup Day Report.** New mortar mix recipe was a success! It was tested on Hawkins cabin and worked well, looks good. Recipe: 1 shovel cement, 1 50 lb. bag of lime, 10 shovels of sand, 1 heaping 12 oz cup of dark brown dye. Total number of volunteers: 126.

John Showalter would like to give free passes for Haunted Village to Girl Scout Troop #1520 that painted fence by the Furnas Cabin. Don Richards moves to give free passes to Haunted Village to troop. Greg Knapik seconds. Motion carries.

Kitchen Report. Debbie Irons will be breaking food bills down to reflect what is used at each event. Debbie presents bill from Perry & Derrick that needs paid. Debbie Irons motions to pay Perry & Derrick. Don Richards seconds. Motion carries. Shelley Pickrell requests \$64.00 for postage. Don

Dunkelberger motions to pay for postage. Larry Burns seconds. Motion carries. Debbie puts out a strong request for volunteer help in the kitchen. She and her kids cannot do it all. Need to set up volunteer schedule. Debbie notes the shower curtains provided by School of the Soldier and requests Thank You note be sent. Debbie acknowledges all the work the kids have been doing and the life lessons that they are learning. Thanks to all who work with them. May want to look at setting up a schedule of 'to do' for kids at events. Kevin looking into dropping phone line from barn to kitchen for emergency phone calls. **Painting.** Perry & Derrick has donated paint. Jerry Zornes would like to use it on stage, outhouse and sassafras booth by Hawkins House. It is decided to hold off on sassafras booth because of repair needed but to do all the others.

Reorganization. Kevin Hurt is overwhelmed with all the things he is trying to take care of. Some reorganization is mandatory. He request a 900 megawatt phone with a 1 mile radius. Insurance. Larry reviews letter from Insurance company. Building #1 in policy seems to be Bullskin Inn. No one is sure what is Building #2 referred to in the policy. Our workers comp. Certificate is out of date. Paperwork from BWC is coming. Whoever receives it should get it to Larry. Our insurance policy renews on May 31st. Larry will hold off on looking into this further until renewal is done. We have insured for fire as our lease requires. Don Richards suggest we try to renegotiate our lease with the state to drop the fire insurance clause. Larry Burns volunteers his services as a risk coordinator, noting disclaimer "Please be advised that I am not a licensed insurance agent, risk manager, or attorney, nor do I have any connections with any such persons. The advice given stems from my previous career as an insurance underwriter which mostly involved personal lines of insurance, not commercial." Don Richards moves to accept said volunteer services. Ed Dorff seconds. Motion carries. Larry Burns abstains. It is general consensus that this is a new officer position, Insurance Coordinator. It needs to be added to the Code of Regulations and all appropriate grantors of the addition.

School of the Soldier. A vote was taken before they left and they want to come back next year. We want to accept with conditions. S. of S. contacts also agree there needs to be more communication. Some problems they had: 1. Toilets stopped up. 2. Not enough hot water for showers. 3. Wished they knew we were serving breakfast. Mic suggest putting donation can in shower and bathroom to help defray cost of upkeep and improving these facilities.

School Days. May 7, 8, 14, 15. 9

a.m. - 12 p.m. Need volunteers to demonstrate and show cabins. Also to open the kitchen to sell drinks, snacks and trinkets. The tour for Little Miami Jr. High is scheduled for May 4th. Kevin will be out of town and will need a few volunteers to help. There are many other tours booked. A schedule needs to be posted to be able to schedule volunteers.

The Fair. Kevin Hurt will contact Rick Duvelius for a status of where things stand.

National Coalition of Trekkers. Several members visited village and loved it. They will be charging \$10/person for attending. They expect about 300 people. All proceeds will go to the village. Also will devote all day Wednesday to labor (example: chinking cabins). Kevin checking on Shooting Range. Federal reps don't want shooting at all due to lead problems but if we can find a definite way to contain the lead, maybe be able to do it. Another consideration with shooting range is insurance. Solution: obtain special permit each time we need it. Larry is expecting information packet regarding shooting range. Trekkers also have insurance to cover shooting range.

Kevin has been receiving a lot of calls from Cinti, initiating from our Channel 5 commercials and listings in "To Do" section of the papers. Kevin spoke with Don Young of the Fabric Shack in Waynesville. They will be setting up a booth at The Fair. This is a good sign of local merchant support.

Action Items are reviewed. Question of Fannigan's Isle playing at Celtic Festival is raised. They are available all day Saturday and Sunday morning. Linda Lee motions to get Fannigan's Isle for 2 sets on Saturday for \$700.00. Ed Dorff seconds. Motion carries. Debbie expresses concern: what will paying for bands at Celtic Festival do to bands that volunteer their time at the June Festival. They may want payment from now on. Discussion follows. The June Festival has always been a volunteer basis to celebrate music. It is understood that the bands play for the love of playing. The other events are jobs for the bands and paid accordingly. Perhaps there are other ways we can compensate these bands for playing in the June Festival. Provide advertising on our web page with links to their homepage, possible hire them for other events, if we get commitments 12 mos. in advance, include them in all the event advertising.

Electrical Code Violations. In progress of getting an electrician to do repairs. Billy Howard's brother is unable to help us. Kevin Hurt and Ed Dorff will check on some other possibilities.

School Days. There's been a lot of rain and some cancellations. About 125 students attend each day. Kitchen made about \$112.50. Need more candy to sell.

The Fair. Items to be done before

this weekend: Check for \$150 for Common Stock. Don Dunkelberger moves to pay Commonstock. Linda Lee seconds. Motion carries. Need 2 openings in the fence to help the flow of traffic.

New member. Welcome to new member John Robinson at tonight's meeting.

Gazebo. We are very close to having plans done. Ceiling is basically OK. The floor is very substandard. There are two options. 1.) Totally rebuild floor structure, dig and pour concrete around poles. 2.) pour concrete pad and tie poles into it. Est. cost \$2000-\$2500. Greg Knapik motions to go with concrete pad. Debbie Irons second. Motion carries.

Music Festival. The Village was looking at purchasing a marquee to house seminars during the Music Festival. It has been decided to hold off on purchase and make do with the tents we have now. 4. In case of an emergency or accident, notify a camp official and we will contact the appropriate local agency. If someone needs to contact you due to an emergency they can call Caesar's Creek at 514-897-4141. Please remember, this number is for EMERGENCIES only.

5. PARENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTIONS OF THEIR CHILDREN. You are responsible for any damage they cause to personal or other property. Also, for their own safety, keep them away from the shooting ranges.

6. NO LOADED FIREARMS IN CAMP. This includes blank rounds.

7. All drinks must be in period containers and foods should be on period correct eatingware. We would like to see all the participants in period proper eyewear, but if you don't have them it will be acceptable. NO SUNGLASSES OR WATCHES OTHER THAN PERIOD PROPER WILL BE ALLOWED. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE LEGALITY OF ANY HIDES, FURS OR OTHER ANIMAL PARTS YOU WISH TO SELL. IF YOU ARE SELLING FOODS BE SURE TO HAVE THE APPROPRIATE PERMITS. Please check with the local authorities before bringing them or contact Caesar's Creek as they may be able to help you with who to talk to.
