New Code of Regulations

Following are the changes made to the Code of Regulations during the Special Membership Meeting on Tuesday, September 28, 1999.

ARTICLE III Membership

There shall be no discrimination in membership by reason of sex, race, creed, color or national origin.

There shall be eleven classes of membership. Qualifications, dues and privileges of each class shall be uniform within each class. All membership classes include all benefits of all lower classes. All membership benefits shall be set or modified by the board of trustees.

Section A Chairman's Circle: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$25,000.00 or more and shall be renewable annually.

Section B President's Circle: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$15,000.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section C Executive's Circle: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$10,000.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section D Advisor's Circle: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$5,000.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section E Leadership Circle: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$2,500.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section F Guardian Club: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$1,000.00 and shall be renewable annually.

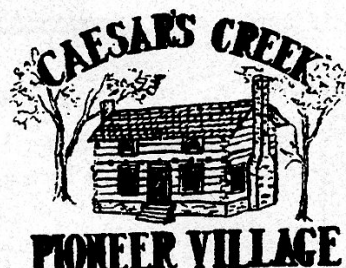

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission and purpose of the Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village Association, a non-profit organization, are as follows:

1. To preserve, restore, and maintain the historic structures of Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village.
(Preservation Function)
 2. To foster, educate and promote a deeper understanding of Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village and its significance to the history of the Southwestern Ohio Frontier during its settlement from 1793-1812. This shall be done by means of research, exhibits, interpretive programs, primitive farming and any other appropriate educational techniques. Also included in this function is a provision for special events that will educate the public. However, these events will not change the permanent historic site. (Education Function)
 3. To establish and maintain collections of objects, furnishings, books, documents and illustrations relating to the history of the settling of the Southwestern Ohio Frontier from 1793-1812. (Collection Function)

Section G Veteran's Club: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$500.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section H Patriot's Club: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$250.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section I Settler's Club: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$100.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section J Pioneer's Club: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$50.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section K Partner/Family: This membership may be an organization, corporation, individual or it may be a family. The fee for this membership shall be \$25.00 and shall be renewable annually.

Section L Honorary Membership: The board of trustees may establish such honorary, associate, student, or special memberships as it deems advisable.

Section M New Membership: New members shall be admitted at such times and subject to such qualifications as may be determined from time to time by the trustees.

Section N Termination of Membership: Any member may resign at any time. Any member may be censured, suspended, or his membership terminated for good cause by a two-thirds vote of the trustees. Any member so suspended or terminated may appeal for reinstatement at the next general meeting of the members, and upon favorable vote of a majority of the members shall be reinstated. Any member resigned from membership or is terminated for any reason shall cease to hold and exercise any office, whether as trustee or otherwise. A membership may be terminated in 90 days from the date for non-payment of membership fees. There will be no refund of membership dues for such members who are suspended, terminated or resigned.

Section O Dues: The dues of the members of this corporation shall be as set forth above and may be changed from time to time by the trustees. Membership in this organization shall be on a yearly basis, renewable on each member's anniversary date.

ARTICLE IV Voting Rights

In all membership classes, in the case of a husband and wife, each shall have one vote, making two votes per family. If the membership is taken out in the name of an organization or individual, that organization or individual will have one vote. Honorary, associate, student or special members shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V Meetings

Section A Annual Meeting: The annual meeting of the memberships of this corporation shall be held at Caesar's Creek Pioneer Village, at 7:30 o'clock p.m., on the second Tuesday in November of each year, or at such other time and place as may be designated in notice of said meeting.

ARTICLE VII Trustees

Section A Term of Office of Trustees: The trustees shall hold office for three years with their terms staggered so that in the annual election of trustees, only three trustees shall be elected for a three-year term. Trustees shall hold office for three consecutive calendar years. Qualified candidates shall be active members in good standing for at least one year.

Section E Meetings of Trustees:

1. Regular meetings of the trustees will be held on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.

Section G Term:

The officers shall hold office for one calendar year or until their successors are elected and qualified, or for such shorter period as the board of trustees may designate.

***The new membership dues will begin on January 1, 2000.

By seeking a means to take on additional paid employees to perform membership development and volunteer coordinator functions, among others.

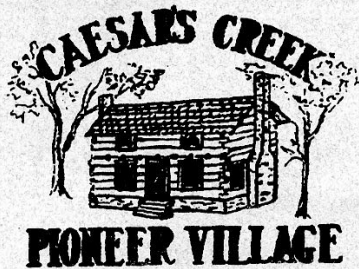
If I am re-elected I will remain committed to these areas.
